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- Historic district designation protects and enhances properties significant to the District of Columbia's historic, cultural, and aesthetic heritage. The designation is made by the DC Historic Preservation Review Board if a district meets one or more of these criteria and the community supports the designation. Some 60 neighborhoods in Washington, DC, have already obtained historic status. Burleith, built primarily in the 1920s–1940s with a distinctive row house style and look, may be a candidate for historic designation.
