## 2. Promoting the Arcadia Book on Burleith

They would like similar information (i.e. contact name and contact information) for media outlets where the book could be publicized.

The majority of the meeting was on this subject. Ross presented a set of thoughts he had put together. Basically he had divided things into 6 categories:
